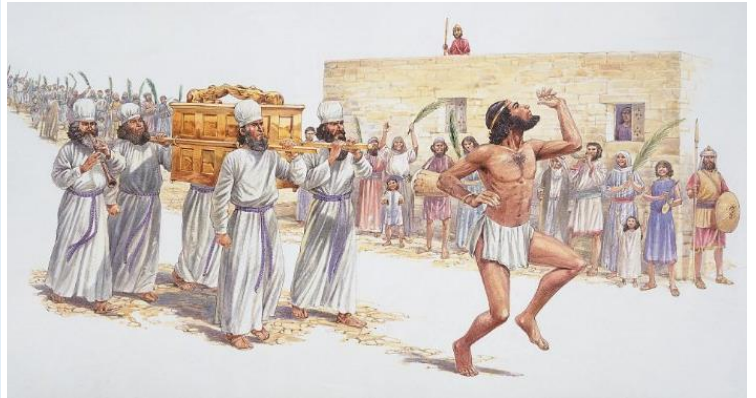

## ***Notes from Parish Council***

Parish Council met on 15<sup>th</sup> June, and the following were amongst the matters discussed:

- Discussion on traditional Presbyterian forms of Membership, and their appropriateness in current times.
- A report from Anne Shave on the Pathways project.
- Hamish to take leave 19-24 July
- Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October: this being the final day of General Assembly, and also World Communion Day, Parish Council agreed that there should be no service here at Cashmere, but that the congregation be invited and encouraged to go to St Andrew's College chapel for the service there.
- Parish Council agreed to approve financing of up to 75% time for a replacement person for Hamish.
- AGM date was set for Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2021
