Points to ponder

The season of Lent begins with stories about a universal human experience: temptation. At some point in our lives, all of us have choices to make about our beliefs and our behaviours; all of us will be "tempted" to think and act in a variety of ways. Today's readings from **Genesis 2** and **Matthew 4** make the point that our choices - how we respond to life's temptations - have consequences both positive and negative for ourselves and the people we love.

- What temptations/choices/decisions are you facing at the moment?
- What have you learned about facing temptations/making decisions along the way?
- What part do you think a person's faith should play in his or her decision-making?
- What do you make of the story of Jesus' temptation?
- Does the fact that Jesus responds to temptation by quoting from his scriptures and refusing to be seduced by the allure of power mean that his followers must respond in a similar way?

In a world filled with need and injustice, the greatest temptation can sometimes be to say and do nothing. The following prayer adapted from *Seasons of the Spirit* offers a Lenten challenge to people of faith

While we keep silence, those who need bread are left hungry.

While we keep silence, those who need a sign are left alone.

While we keep silence, those who need help shout into the distance.

While we keep silence, those who need comfort receive no comforting word.

We confess those times when we have not spoken up for the hungry,

When we have waited for divine intervention

rather than reaching out with our own hands.

We confess those times when we have quietly gone along with the crowd,

Rather than answering God's call to bring justice to the world.

We confess those times when we've stood back rather than cross the gulf

between ourselves and others;

When we've ignored the cries of suffering for the sake of a quiet life.

We repent of the way of disinterest;

We turn from the path of apathetic silence.

We turn towards the living example of Jesus

to inspire and inform everything that we do.
