Christian Economic Summit

The Christian Economic Summit is happening in Christchurch and online - Thursday 26th to Saturday 28th November. It is a strategic opportunity to connect with other people who have a Kingdom vision and want to be tangible about serving, and part of real solutions for our community and country.

There will be Forums to link people around key topics such as farming, housing, finance & banking, innovation, leadership, solar power, indigenous development, media... to create opportunity for synergy. Sharing resources, hearing what is and can happen, and meeting people who have a similar interest and involvement is part of setting the ground for new initiatives, and for strengthening and extending existing ones.

People who are global leaders, involved in influencing governments, cities and different spheres, will be speaking. What is shared will be inspiring - a combination of thinking about our paradigms and practice, and hearing stories and examples of what has happened.

Relationships are key - locally, nationally, globally. Our focus is on growing meaningful relationships and seeing God's interconnected body operating in business, government and the spheres of influence where God has put us to hear and implement His strategies for operating in a truly Kingdom way.

At the Christian Economic Summit we will be wanting to connect meaningfully, think deeply, so that we can act transformationally.

Because CES is online as well as in Christchurch, people who are unable to attend in person can watch online at the time or at a time that suits. There is tremendous value in coming to the live event as it facilitates meeting people, as so much develops in catalytic, and unexpected ways as we connect with others. Those who attend the live event will also have access to the sessions on demand, so that what happens becomes an ongoing resource for everyone.
