Scripture Reading (*Reader: Annette McAdam*)

Job 23:1-9 & 16-17: *The Book of Job is one of the more interesting books in the Hebrew scriptures, because it is not historical or prophetic, rather it stands with the wisdom material of Proverbs, and Ecclesiastes. The subject of the narrative is as old as the hills and as modern as the Space age. If God is just and good, why does God let innocent people suffer?*

I still rebel and complain against God;
